一 依據國家科學及技術委員會108年6月14日第1080037391B號文有關「國家科學及技術委員會補助大學校院培育優秀博士生獎學金試辦方案」中之規定，特訂定「東海大學『國家科學及技術委員會補助大學校院培育優秀博士生獎學金試辦方案』獎勵規定要點」(以下簡稱本獎勵要點)。

二 獎勵名額分配：

本獎勵博士生員額之規定是依國家科學及技術委員會就本校前四年度獲得國家科學及技術委員會補助具研究性質之研究計畫經費為基準，按比例核算獎勵員額。

本校獲核定員額之分配以設有博士班科系，其前四年度獲得國家科學及技術委員會補助具研究性質之研究計畫經費總額的排序做為分配之順序。基於領域平衡考量，人文社會領域科系之研究計畫經費加權150%計算。

分配由高至低依序一系分配一名。所有博士班科系分配完後仍有餘額，則再由前述順序，進行下一輪之分配。

三

獎勵對象：

本獎勵規定獎勵對象為本校當年度入學之博士班一年級新生。依教育部臺灣獎學金作業要點第1點規定，本試辦方案不包括大陸地區、香港及澳門學生。

評選標準為博士班新生須提供以下審查資料作為評選標準：推薦信(系主任、博士班指導教授或碩士論文指導教授擇一)、博士班研究計畫與碩士論文各一式一份，以及其它有助審查之資料。

本獎勵審查由教務長、研發長，以及各博士班系所的系(所)主任共同組成審查委員會進行審查，並提交本校獎助學金委員會核定。

四

定期評量與遞補機制：

獲得本獎勵之博士生在領取獎學金的四年內，每學期期末需撰寫研究進度與成果報告。

指導教授(如未有指導教授則由系主任或學位學程主任)針對其學業成績、研究進度與成果予以評估是否能繼續領取本獎勵，並提交系務或學程會議審定，如未獲通過者，取消其獎勵資格。

獲得本獎勵之博士生若四年期間辦理休退學或違反相關校規則取消其獎勵資格。

前述取消獎勵資格者，其名額遞補方式依照本要點第二條分配之規定，由該生獲獎年度之排序依序遞補。

五

獎勵成果效益追蹤機制：

本校將追蹤獲獎生在校期間之學業研究表現以及畢業後之流向。

受獎勵博士生之所屬系所，須定期追蹤獲獎生在校期間之學業研究成果表現，並應於每學年度畢業生流向追蹤機制中，追蹤受獎勵學生畢業後三年內之職涯發展，獲獎生不得拒絕。

六

本獎學金依「國家科學及技術委員會補助大學校院培育優秀博士生獎學金試辦方案」之規定，本校每學年編列獎學金預算科目予以支應。

七

本項獎學金之領取，以不重複領取本校現行之優秀新生入學獎勵及外國學生獎助學金等補助為原則，獲獎學生並須書立放棄切結書以為憑。

八

本要點經獎助學金委員會、行政會議通過後實施。

- I. Pursuant to the provisions outlined in the National Science and Technology Council's official document No. 1080037391B, dated June 14, 2019, regarding the "NSTC Scholarship Program to Cultivate Outstanding Doctoral Students (Pilot Program)," THU hereby establishes the "THU Guidelines Governing Rewards for "NSTC Scholarship Program to Cultivate Outstanding Doctoral Students (Pilot Program)"(hereinafter referred to as Guidelines).

- II. Allocation of Award Quotas:
The number of award recipients is determined based on the total amount of research-related project funding granted to the THU by the NSTC over the preceding four academic years. Quotas are allocated proportionally according to this funding amount.
The allocation of approved quotas to doctoral programs is based on a ranking of departments with doctoral programs, determined by the total amount of NSTC-funded research project grants received over the past four years. To ensure balanced development across academic fields, research funding received by departments in the humanities and social sciences is weighted at 150%.
Quotas are distributed in descending order of funding, with one award allocated to each department. If there are remaining quotas after all eligible departments have received one award, the allocation process shall repeat in the same order for subsequent rounds.

- III. Eligibility:
This award is intended for first-year doctoral students newly admitted to THU in the current academic year. In accordance with Article 1 of the MOE Taiwan Scholarship Program Directions, this pilot program is not applicable to students from Mainland China, Hong Kong, or Macao.
Applicants must submit the following materials for review: one letter of recommendation (from either their department chair, doctoral advisor, or master's thesis advisor), a doctoral research proposal, a copy of their master's thesis, and any other supporting documents.
Applications will be reviewed by a selection committee composed of the Dean of Academic Affairs, the Dean of Research and Development, and the chairs of the respective doctoral programs. Final approval shall be granted by THU's Scholarship Committee.

- IV. Regular Evaluation and Waitlist System:

During the four-year scholarship period, recipients are required to submit a report on their research progress and outcomes at the end of each semester.

The advisor (or, if an advisor has not yet been assigned, the department chair or program director) shall evaluate the student's academic grades, research progress, and outcomes to determine whether the student is eligible to continue receiving the scholarship. The evaluation results must be submitted to the department or program committee for approval. Failure to acquire approval will lead to the student's scholarship eligibility being revoked. Scholarship eligibility will also be revoked for any recipients that temporarily or permanently withdraw from THU or violates THU regulations during the four-year period. Revoked scholarships will be awarded to other doctoral students in accordance with Article 2 of the Guidelines herein, the waitlist will comprise of students evaluated in the same year as the disqualified student.

V. Tracking Scholarship Outcomes:

THU shall track recipient's academic and research performance during their time at THU and careers after graduation.

The recipient's department or institutes shall regularly track the recipient's academic and research performance while at THU and also track the recipient's career development for the three years following graduation in their annual alumni career surveys. Recipients shall comply with all tracking efforts.

VI. In compliance with the NSTC Scholarship Program to Cultivate Outstanding Doctoral Students (Pilot Program), THU shall earmark an annual budget to support the scholarship program.

VII. Recipients of this specific scholarship shall not concurrently receive THU's Scholarship for Outstanding New Students or Scholarships for International Students. Recipients shall also sign a waiver form declaring that they are not receiving other aforementioned scholarships.

VIII. The Guidelines herein shall be promulgated upon approval by the Scholarship Committee and approval at the Administrative Affairs Meeting.
